Special Action Cards in UNO No Mercy

- Draw Two: Forces the next player to draw two cards.
 Draw Four: Next player draws four and skips their turn.
- Skip: Prevents the next player from making a move. - Reverse: Changes the turn order.
- Discard All: Allows a player to discard all cards of a single color

Stacking and Advanced Moves

UNO No Mercy allows stacking of Draw Two and Draw Four cards. Players can also use Reverse and Skip cards strategically to gain an advantage.

UNO No Mercy Plus 100 Feature

The Plus 100 card forces a player to draw 100 cards, making a comeback nearly impossible. It is the ultimate penalty card in the game

How to Win UNO No Mercy

Use wild and action cards strategically.
Stack penalties on opponents whenever possible.
Always call 'UNO!' when down to one card.
Bluff with Draw Four to force opponents into bad moves.
